

API Terms

1.1 Using Our APIs

1. By accessing or using our APIs, you are agreeing to the terms below. If there is a conflict between these Terms and additional terms applicable to a given API, the additional terms will control for that conflict. Terms of other ThinPrint services apply in addition when used together with the APIs.
2. When using our APIs, you will:
 - a. require your end users to comply with applicable law, regulation, and these Terms.
 - b. comply with all applicable law, regulation, and third-party rights.
 - c. not use the APIs to encourage or promote illegal activity or violation of third-party rights.
 - d. only access or attempt to access an API by the means described in the documentation of that API.
 - e. not misrepresent or mask either your identity or your API Client's identity when using the APIs or developer accounts.
 - f. agree to, and not attempt to circumvent limits on your use of our APIs (e.g. limiting the number of API requests) which we may set.
 - g. keep your credentials confidential and make reasonable efforts to prevent and stop other API Clients from using them. Since developer credentials are intended to be used by you and identify your API Client, they may not be embedded in open source projects.

1.2 Your API Clients

1. The APIs are designed to help you enhance your websites and applications ("API Client(s)").
2. ThinPrint does not acquire ownership in your API Clients, and by using our APIs, you do not acquire ownership of any rights in our APIs, services or products.
3. ThinPrint may monitor use of the APIs to ensure quality, improve Services and compliance with these Terms.
4. We may suspend access to the APIs by you or your API Client without notice if we reasonably believe that you are in violation of these Terms.

1.3 User Privacy and API Clients

1. You will comply with all applicable privacy laws and regulations including those applying to personally identifiable information (PII).
2. You will use commercially reasonable efforts to protect user information collected by your API Client, including personally identifiable information ("PII"), from unauthorized access or use and will promptly report to your users any unauthorized access or use of such information to the extent required by applicable law.

3. By using our APIs, we may use submitted information in accordance with our privacy policies.

1.4 Restrictions to the API usage

1. When using the APIs, you may not:
 - Sublicense an API to a third party.
 - Introduce or intent to introduce to ThinPrint services items of destructive nature like viruses, worms, malware, etc.
 - Interfere with or disrupt the APIs or the servers or networks providing the APIs.
 - Reverse engineer or attempt to extract the source code from any API, except to the extent that this restriction is expressly prohibited by law.

1.5 Content

1. ThinPrint does not acquire any ownership of any intellectual property rights in the content that you submit to our APIs.
2. You will ensure that you have the necessary rights to submit content to our APIs before doing so.
3. You may not share a user's content obtained through the APIs with others without explicit consent from that user.
4. Unless expressly permitted by the content owner or by applicable law, you will not or enable others to do the following with content returned from the APIs:
 - a. Scrape, build databases, or otherwise create permanent copies of content, or keep cached copies longer than permitted;
 - b. Copy, translate, modify, sell, lease, lend, convey, distribute, publicly display, or sublicense to any third party.

1.6 Termination

1. You may stop using our APIs at any time.
2. ThinPrint reserves the right to terminate or discontinue the APIs or any portion or feature or your access thereto for any reason and at any time without liability or other obligation to you.
3. Upon discontinuation of your access to an API, you will immediately stop using the API and delete any cached or stored content. ThinPrint may independently communicate with any account owner whose account(s) are associated with your API Client to provide notice of the termination of your right to use an API.
4. When these Terms come to an end, those terms that by their nature are intended to continue indefinitely will continue to apply, including but not limited to: 7.3.2, 7.4.1, 7.4.2, 7.6.3 and 7.7.4
